- **Squarespace:** visually-driven site management platform for creatives, integrated solution for your site building and CMS needs.
- **Wix:** user-friendly and supportive, offering AI assisted site setup and 24/7 customer support to help you quickly grow your business.
- **Weebly:** popular website builder, simple to create a basic website, also one of the cheapest website builders.

PROS

- Easy to set up; no messing with hosting, installation, or servers
- Let you build a website quickly
- Easy to customize and manage your stores
- Won't have to worry about updates or backups
- Don't need lots of in-house technical resources
- 100% free

wordpress.org

PROS

- 100% free to download
- Allow uploading custom plugins
- Unlimited potential for customization
- Get access to more free and premium themes
- Make money by running your own ads without sharing the revenue
- Able to use Google Analytics for custom analytics and tracking
- Give you full control of your files and codes

THE ULTIMATE COMPARISON (2021)

CONS

- Paid upgrades for advanced customizations, Google Analytics integration and domain name changing
- Not allowed to sell ads on your website; have to apply for their advertising program called
- WordAds where you share revenue with them
- Unable to upload plugins
- Limited number of free themes and doesn't let you to create your own
- Limited extension possibilities
- Doesn't give you full control of the site

CONS

- Requires you to buy your own hosting and domain name
- Have to set up and install yourself
- You're responsible for maintaining, updating and managing your website and server
- You're responsible for backups
